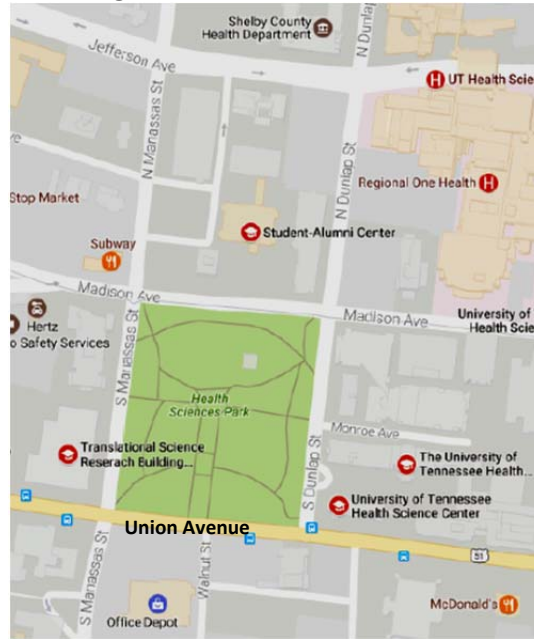
SPEAKERS

Ronald Pfeiffer, MD is Professor of Neurology at Oregon Health & Science University (OHSU). Dr. Pfeiffer was Vice-Chair of the University of Tennessee Health Science Center Department of Neurology prior to his move to Portland. Dr. Pfeiffer specializes in Parkinson disease and other movement disorders. In addition to working with the OHSU Parkinson Center of Oregon and Movement Disorders Clinic, he collaborates with other specialties throughout OHSU, including gastroenterology and the Nerve Center to study gastrointestinal dysfunction and motility disorders as well as other manifestations of autonomic dysfunction in Parkinson disease. Dr. Pfeiffer has a long track record of seminal studies related to the pathogenesis and treatment of Parkinson disease. He is Co-Editor of the journal *Parkinsonism and Related Disorders* and has authored several textbooks on Parkinson disease.

Peter Konrad, MD, PhD is Professor of Neurological Surgery and Biomedical Engineering and Director of Functional Neurosurgery at Vanderbilt University. Dr. Konrad is a central figure in one of the largest DBS programs in the United States. He has been closely involved in the development of software and hardware tools for optimization of DBS electrode placement. His other research and clinical interests include epilepsy, trigeminal neuralgia, and optical stimulation of neural tissue.

Mark LeDoux, MD, PhD is Professor of Neurology and Anatomy & Neurobiology at the University of Tennessee Health Science Center. Dr. LeDoux is a movement disorders specialist and clinician-scientist actively involved in clinical and basic science research related to the treatment, genetics and molecular biology of movement disorders. Dr. LeDoux evaluates and treats patients with Parkinson disease at Wesley Neurology Clinic.
